Processional Song: Hail Mary, Gentle Woman

Leader: As we gather today to honor Mary, Queen of the Missions, we ask for her intercession in our lives and the lives of children everywhere, that we may all come to know and love her son, Jesus, and be willing to share Him with others.

Reader 1: Matthew 25:34-40

Then the king will say to those on his right,
'Come, you who are blessed by my Father.
Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the
foundation of the world.
For I was hungry and you gave me food,
I was thirsty and you gave me drink,
a stranger and you welcomed me,
naked and you clothed me,

Reader 2: We come together as members of the
universal Church to pray for children around the world.

We know that many are without the things we count on in our own lives - regular meals, medicine when we are sick, a good school to attend, a loving family, and a safe place to live. Jesus speaks of them in our reading as "...the least of my brothers." Our missionary vocation also calls us to remember that many of these children do not know how much Jesus loves them. As part of this Catholic community, it is our job to change that reality. Through our prayers and sacrifices, let us work towards the day when all children will live in the love and peace of Jesus.

All: Amen

Twelve children gather in a line at a microphone, each to lead a prayer of a decade of the rosary. (If possible, the Hail Marys should be spoken in different languages, representing all areas of the world.)

1. Our Father
- 2.-11. Hail Mary
12. Glory Be

Leader: God our Father, giver of all good things, You have blessed us in many ways. Help us to reach out to our brothers and sisters in other countries with our prayers and sacrifices so that they too may feel the gift of Your grace and love. We ask this through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

All: Amen.

World Mission Rosary



Use the colors of the World Mission Rosary to make an oversized Rosary out of links of paper.

Materials needed: 24 each – green, red, white, blue yellow; clear contact paper to cover all paper strips; stapler/staples; cross/crucifix, approximately 12 inches tall; string/rope to connect cross to links.

Cut strips of paper 4”x 11”

- 10 green
- 11 red
- 16 white
- 11 blue
- 11 yellow

Lay strips of construction paper on contact paper leaving about 1/4” from the edge and leaving the same space between each strip. Cover strips with another sheet of contact paper, sealing them between the two layers. Cut strips apart along gap between colored papers. Using a stapler, make loops out of each strip, connecting them in the order shown in the picture above. Using string, tie last loop to the cross/crucifix. (Refer to picture above and on prayer service to see completed rosary)
